# DESIGN EDUCATORS CONFERENCE CALL FOR PROPOSALS (2015-17)

The AIGA Design Educators Community (DEC) announces a Call for Proposals to members interested in producing an AIGA Design Educators Conference. The next series of four conferences will begin in Fall 2015 with the first organized by the DEC in conjunction with the National AIGA Design Conference in New Orleans. Deadline for proposal submission is March 31, 2015.

The AIGA Design Educators Community Steering Committee is seeking individuals or groups within various geographic regions who would be willing to assume leadership positions in producing a design educators conference in 2016 or 2017. The AIGA Design Educators Community is now midway through its current conference series, having successfully produced *Connecting Dots* at the University of Cincinnati (Spring 2014) and *New Ventures: Intersections in Design Education* in Portland (Fall 2014). We are looking forward to *Spaces of Learning* (Spring 2015) at York University in Toronto. These conferences provide an opportunity for design educators to:

- -Present research and teaching methodologies to experienced educators and practitioners as well as to rising designers, educators and students
- -Learn more about pedagogy, history, theory, studio practices, methodology and technology
- -Gather as a community to share ideas and insights about advancing and improving design education

As a series, the conferences respond to design education issues such as criticism, sustainability, pedagogical models and transnational contexts. We welcome insights about new areas of interest, connections or concerns that design educators must address in the near future.

# DEADLINE

Please submit your proposal by March 31, 2015 to Design Educators Community Steering Committee members Kenneth FitzGerald (kfitzger@odu.edu) or Karen Zimmermann (kzim@email.arizona.edu). Proposals should be submitted as a PDF. Proposals received after this deadline will not be accepted.

#### **REVIEW PROCESS**

Submit a two-page proposal outlining your interest in producing a conference. The submitted proposals will be reviewed by the DEC Steering Committee. Selections are based on: the quality and relevance of the conference theme; the variety of themes that will comprise the conference series; the suggested time and location; how well the conference objectives meet the vision of the AIGA Design Educators Community; and the leadership abilities of the conference committee. Selections will be announced in May 2015.

# WHAT YOUR PROPOSAL SHOULD ADDRESS

# **O1 Conceptual statement**

Outline your interest in producing an AIGA Design Educators Community conference. Your conference may be modeled after those previously produced (including *Revolution*, *FutureHistory*, *Schools of Thoughts*, *Design Frontier*, *Intent/Content*, *Response\_Ability*, *Blunt*, and *New Contexts / New Practices*), or it may devise a new format. Please describe your interest in producing a conference. This should include specific concepts for the conference, their relevance to today's educational environment, and how these concepts differ from other conferences.

# **O2 Programming structure**

Conference organizers are given liberty to produce unique programming. In light of this, please articulate your ideas for conference programming. We actively seek innovative programming and formatting that allow conferences to be more inclusive and interactive.

### **O3 Support**

Describe the support for a conference within the design educator community in your region. We encourage you to partner with your local AIGA chapter when possible. Please describe any partnering opportunities, listing what other regional groups or members would be involved and in what capacities. Outline any experience your team may have with producing conferences or other large-scale events.

#### 04 Planning team

Provide the names, contact information, and short bios for the individuals who will take leadership roles in the conference production. While a full committee may yet to be formed, it is essential to identify the point person(s) responsible for the production of any future conference. Conference planning committees must contain a minimum of four members.

### **05 Potential dates**

The timing for the conferences will be as follows: Spring 2016, Fall 2016 and Spring 2017. List in rank order the time period and potential dates to produce your conference. Specifying the particular month you prefer for your conference is advised, but be aware that this may be subject to change. The Steering Committee will attempt to accommodate submitters' preferred event dates.

# **OPERATION AND BUDGET**

Each conference will be responsible for establishing and managing its own budget. Adobe Systems has generously offered \$10,000 to support each of the four AIGA Design Educators Conferences in 2015-17. Please be aware that this seed money does not typically cover all the expenses of the conference.

Conferences must be branded as an "AIGA Design Educators Conference" with the tagline "AIGA Design Educators Conference" appearing prominently on all event promotions. Conferences will be supported by the AIGA Design Educators Community Steering Committee, who will offer advice, their knowledge base, suggestions for additional support, etc.

The DEC Steering Committee will provide access to a conference handbook to groups preparing proposals. (Please note: an overview of the handbook is being drafted for a Spring 2015 release.) The handbook is not meant to be comprehensive or prescriptive, but it does offer recommendations based on past successes. If your proposal is accepted, you will be expected to follow the requirements outlined in the handbook.
